- The College's auditors reported that financial statements have been finalized and submitted to the Illinois Community College Board with no findings and no deficiencies.
- The Testing Center has been recertified for five years by the National College Testing Center Association.
- The College has been awarded a second cycle of grant funding for the Workforce Equity Initiative Grant in the amount of \$1.046 million to serve unemployed and underemployed individuals in high-need communities.
- Triton received the Future of Industry Award from the Nuts, Bolts & Thingamajigs Foundation for our summer manufacturing camps.
