Norma Hernandez was elected to the Triton College Board of Trustee in April 2021. She is a Community Development Planner at the University of Illinois at Chicago Great Cities Institute. At UIC, she engages in the intersection of academic research and community engagement through an initiative called Participatory Budgeting Chicago which focuses on building a more participatory democracy within local government. She is also part of the Latino Research Initiative, where she works with academic scholars on how to improve the lives of Latinos in the Chicago Metro Area.
